

PM Visit to China



n 26th October 2016 PM Lee Hsien Loong sent a congratulatory message to President Xi Jinping and Premier Li Keqiang on their respective re-appointments to the of the People's Republic of China, 26 October 2017 19th Communist Party of China Central Committee Politburo Standing Committee. In his message he singled the following areas he hoped both nations will continue working closely together on:

"I look forward to continue working with you to strengthen Singapore-China cooperation, particularly in areas such as the Sino-Singapore (Chongqing) Connectivity Initiative, the Belt and Road Initiative, finance, defence as well as legal and judicial matters. As you had mentioned during my recent visit to Beijing, our two countries share strategic congruence over many issues and this will form a strong foundation for us to bring our relations to new heights." He also highlighted how Singapore's turn as incoming ASEAN Chair in 2018 will coincide with the 15th anniversary of ASEAN-China strategic partnership. He said, "Singapore looks forward to working with China and other ASEAN members to further broaden and deepen ASEAN-China cooperation for the mutual benefit of our peoples."

The mention in his message of his Official Visit to China (Beijing and Xiamen, Fujian Province from 19 to 21 September 2017) it was at the invitation of the Premier of the State Council of the People's Republic of China Li Keqiang.



India Takes Centrestage in Singapore & ASEAN Sphere in January 2018 with Major Diaspora Convention

The major annual diaspora convention Pravasi Bharatiya Divas (PBD) or Non-Resident India Day will be held in Singapore on 6th to 7th January 2018. Next year the accent of the annual celebration will be on marking the 25th year of of strategic partnership between India and ASEAN.

This will culminate in the India-ASEAN Commemorative Summit in New Delhi on 25th January 2018 involving leaders of all ten ASEAN members who will also be the chief guests at India's Republic Day on January 26.

For the India-ASEAN PBD in Singapore, if all goes well and according to plan, the response from the Indian diaspora expected to attend is thought to be at least 3,000 participants, making it one of the largest groups to attend a MICE event in Singapore. The PBD is organised by India's Ministry of External Affairs and guests will include Union Ministers, Chief Ministers of India, leading statesmen, leading figures involved in the world of academia, culture, industry, entertainment and

According to the High Commissioner of India, Singapore, HE Jawed Ashraf, "The theme of the PBD Convention is "Ancient Route, New Journey: Diaspora in the Dynamic India-ASEAN Partnership". The twoday event will feature discussions on a broad range of issues with outcomes that deepens diaspora's relations with India and their role in promoting closer ties between India and ASEAN; events to engage the diaspora youth; business, finance, technology events; and, a gala dinner with cultural show. There will be exhibitions, competitions, cinema, yoga and Ayurveda, too."

He also said Singapore can look forward to "officials from key ministries in New Delhi; and chambers of commerce are expected to participate in the event. We also expect the leadership in Singapore and the region, as also persons of eminence from the Indian community to participate."

Chief Minister of Maharashtra Announced Infrastructure **Projects for City and Airports with Singapore**

he Chief Minister (CM) of Maharashtra, Devendra Fadnavis led a delegation comprising senior officials of the state government on his first visit since taking office in October 2014. The visit is part of a growing cooperation iniative to promote economic partnership between Singapore and Maharashtra. An official statement highlighted the state accounts for 15% of India's GDP; 25% of Indian exports; and 30% of Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) into India. In 2016, Maharashtra received US\$29 billion in FDI which is 46% of the

total FDI received by India that year.

During his visit, he called on Singapore's Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong and Deputy Prime Minister and Coordinating Minister for Economic and Social Policies, Tharman Shanmugaratnam. The High Commission of India (HCI), Singapore organised an Investment Roundtable event with leading companies and financial institutions based in Singapore where the CM cochaired the event with Singapore's Minister of Trade and Industry (Industry) S Iswaran. The CM also visited Changi Airport's new

The CM invited Singapore investors to participate in the large range of business opportunities in Maharashtra state. In a press conference here he also announced the state will join with Singapore Airport International Pte Ltd in a greenfield airport development project in Pune. He said, "I have offered the partnership of Maharashtra government in the new airport at Pune and passenger and cargo airport at Nagpur." They will also work on upgrading Babasaheb Ambedkar International Airport at Nagpur into a regional logistics and cargo

He also disclosed that the delegation had discussions with businesses here that included Surbana Juorng for the masterplans for Pune and Nagpur.

Dr Devendra Fadnavis is also the 57th Lee Kuan Yew Exchange Fellow and delivered the Institute of South Asian Studies (ISAS)-Confederation of Indian Industry Chief Minister Lecture titled 'Infrastructure-led Growth: Maharashtra - India's **Engine of Development** on 28th September 2017 at the Hilton Singapore. PA Seeks to Strengthen Economic Cooperation & Integration Among its Members

A is a strategic platform for in-depth economic and commercial integration with a clear focus on the Asia-Pacific region. It was founded six years ago by Chile, Colombia, Mexico and Peru. Currently Australia, Canada, New Zealand and Singapore are seeking 'Associate Country' status in the Alliance

The above mentioned four Latin American embassies here together with IE Singapore organised a seminar on **Trade and Investment Opportunities with the PA** on 28th September 2017. Along with the ambassadors, the seminar speakers also included HE Peter Govindasamy, Director of International Trade Cluster, Singapore Ministry of Trade and Industry and Chief Negotiator Free Trade Agreement PA and Singapore.

They presented a formidable case for the future of the Alliance. Taken as an economic block the countries of the PA make up almost 40% of the GDP of Latin America with a total population of almost 220 million. The average GDP per capita in the PA is over US\$17,5000 measured in "purchasing power parity". The majority of its population is young and the PA is a market that is increasing dynamically with its constantly growing purchasing power. Over the next five years, economists envisaged that as a bloc PA will rank fourth in its contribution to the world's growth.

The ASEAN Leaders exchanged views on regional and international issues with their counterparts during the 20th ASEAN Plus Three Summit, the 12th East Asia Summit, and Summits with China, India, Japan, the

Republic of Korea, and the United Nations.

They also held Commemorative Summits with Canada, the European Union, and the United States to mark the 40th Anniversary of ASEAN's relations with these Dialogue Partners.

As Singapore will take on the ASEAN Chairmanship in 2018, Prime Minister Lee also delivered brief remarks at the Closing Ceremony of the 31st ASEAN Summit and Related Summits on 14 November 2017.

ICE IN THE TROPICS A Canada 150 - Finland 100 **Singapore Arctic Collaboration**




