56TH ASEAN FOREIGN MINISTERS' MEETING **IN JAKARTA**

Singapore's Minister for Foreign Affairs Dr Vivian Balakrishnan visited Jakarta for the 56th ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Meeting (AMM), Post Ministerial Conferences (PMCs), 24th ASEAN Plus Three (APT) Foreign Ministers' Meeting (FMM), 13th East Asia Summit (EAS) FMM, and 30th ASEAN Regional Forum (ARF) from 11th to 14th July 2023.


The 56th AMM reviewed ASEAN's Community Building efforts and reaffirm ASEAN Centrality and unity amidst the evolving regional architecture. The Ministers also discussed ASEAN's post-pandemic recovery and economic integration, as well as progress in building the foundation for long-term growth and development

under Indonesia's Chairmanship theme "ASEAN Matters: Epicentrum of Growth". This was the first AMM attended by Timor-Leste as an Observer.

ASEAN also engaged its Dialogue Partners at the PMCs, namely Australia, Canada, China, the European Union, India, Japan, the United Kingdom, New Zealand, the Republic of Korea, Russia, and the United States. At the 24th APT FMM, 13th EAS FMM, and 30th ARF, Minister Balakrishnan also exchanged views with his counterparts on regional and international developments and discuss ways to enhance regional peace and stability.

DR BALAKRISHNAN ANNOUNCES NEW RESIDENT EMBASSY IN DILI





Minister Balakrishnan called on President Ramos-Horta to discuss bilateral relations

SINGAPORE'S Minister for Foreign Affairs Dr Vivian Balakrishnan was on an Official Visit to the Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste from 23rd to 27th July 2023. He called on President José Ramos-Horta and Prime Minister Xanana Gusmão, and met Minister of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation Bendito dos Santos Freitas on 24th July 2023.

Minister Balakrishnan also conveyed Singapore's decision to establish a resident Embassy in Dili. The Timorese leaders warmly welcomed this announcement, recognizing the Embassy's potential to serve as a pivotal point for expanding bilateral cooperation in various areas, including trade and investment, tourism, defense, energy, and human resources. During the visit he also launched the Singapore Community Association in Dili.

FACETIME IN JUNE AND JULY 2023



UK Deputy Prime Minister Oliver Dowden was on a working visit to Singapore from 27th to 29th June 2023. Discussions focused on trade, digital cooperation, and emerging technologies, with both countries acknowledging the importance of recent agreements such as the UK-Singapore FTA and the Digital Economy Agreement.



Mr Yuan Jiajun, a Member of the Political Bureau of the Communist Party of China (CPC) Central Committee and Secretary of the CPC Chongqing Municipal Committee visited Singapore from 16th to 19th July 2023. He spoke at the China-Singapore (Chongqing) Demonstration Initiative on Strategic Connectivity Forum.



H.R.H. Tunku Ismail Ibni Sultan Ibrahim, Tunku Mahkota (Crown Prince) Johor, concluded a successful three-day Official Visit to Singapore on 12th July 2023. The visit aimed to strengthen ties between the two nations and was marked by warm hospitality and high-level engagements. The Crown Prince was accompanied by H.H. Che' Puan Besar Khaleeda Binti Bustamam.



Asst. Minister to the Prime Minister and Asst. Minister for the Public Service of Australia, Mr. Patrick Gorman, visited Singapore from 2nd to 5th July 2023 through the S R Nathan Fellowship. He met with prominent Singaporean ministers and government agencies to discuss various topics.



Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam, Bui Thanh Son, made an official visit to Singapore from 17th to 18th July 2023. Both nations celebrated the 50th anniversary of their diplomatic relations and the 10th anniversary of the Singapore-Vietnam Strategic Partnership. Foreign Minister Son and Dr. Balakrishnan were joint guests-of-honour at a Dinner Reception hosted by the Vietnamese Embassy in Singapore on 17th July 2023



Minister in the Prime Minister's Office, Second Minister for Foreign Affairs, and Second Minister for Education Dr Maliki Bin Osman made a working visit to North Sumatra and Aceh, Indonesia, from 10th to 14th July 2023. He met with regional leaders as well as leaders of local religious organisations.



Senior Minister and Coordinating Minister for National Security, Mr. Teo Chee Hean, called on Israeli President Isaac Herzog on 10th July 2023 during his working visit to Israel and the Palestinian Territories. Singapore has committed to supporting the Palestinian Authority through the Singapore Cooperation Programme and donated US\$50,000 to UN Relief and Works Agency for Jenin.

They discussed strengthening bilateral cooperation, including the 9th Singapore-Brunei Young Leaders' Programme, Minister Ong also met other Bruneian officials to explore collaboration in digital economy, food and medical supplies, and sustainability.


To commemorate their outstanding contributions, each diplomat was awarded a special DCCS commemorative plaque during the farewell ceremony.


This longstanding relationship started from people-to-people tacts between the two countries. Today it has extended to cooperation between the two nations spanning various sec-

SINGAPORE AND MALDIVES **MULTIPLYING STRENGTH ON MANY FRONTS**

IN Diplomacy sought the views of H.E. Ahmed Thasmeen Ali, the High Commissioner of Maldives to Singapore, on bilateral ties, trade initiatives, investment opportunities, and upcoming programmes that bring both island nations together

How would you describe the current state of bilateral ties between Maldives and Singapore?

HC: The bilateral ties between Maldives and Singapore is excellent. We've had long-standing good relations at both the Government-to-Government level and among the people. Our relationship continues to strengthen.

Can you provide an overview of the major agreements or partnerships that exist between Maldives and Singapore?

HC: Certainly! We have some significant agreements and partnerships between our countries. For instance, the Singapore Cooperation Programme (SCP) has seen substantial participation from Maldivian individuals. There's also a 2-year Technical Assistance Programme set to start this year, signed during President Solih's State Visit to Singapore in 2019.

In terms of trade facilitation, are there any ongoing initiatives to further strengthen trade ties?

HC: We are actively coordinating efforts to explore new avenues for exporting food products to Singapore, with a particular focus on fresh seafood. This is possible due to the current level of air connectivity between our countries.

How has the High Commission of Maldives in Singapore actively contributed to promoting bilateral investment and trade between the two countries?

HC: The High Commission has been actively involved in promoting investment and trade between Maldives and Singapore. We collaborate closely with various Chambers of Commerce in Singapore, as well as with Tourism partners like NATAS, Enterprise Singapore, and Temasek Foundation. We also act as a bridge between businesses seeking to invest in or expand their operations to Maldives and relevant authorities in Maldives.

Are there any recent success stories or notable investments made by Singaporean companies in the Maldives? How have these investments contributed to the bilateral relationship?

HC: Certainly! Several Singaporean companies have made significant investments in the tourism sector in Maldives. Many renowned hotel franchises from Singapore have established their presence in our country, and this has greatly contributed to strengthening our bilateral relationship.

Are there any specific sectors or industries in which Maldives is actively seeking investment from Singapore? What makes these sectors attractive for Singaporean investors?

HC: Yes, Maldives is actively seeking investment from Singapore in sectors such as tourism diversification, renewable energy, waste management, and vocational training. These sectors offer growth potential and the opportunity to contribute to sustainable development in Maldives, making them attractive to Singaporean investors.

How has the Maldives positioned itself as an attractive investment destination?

HC: Maldives has enjoyed strong and sustained economic growth. The country's infrastructure, including connectivity, has seen considerable development. The annual growth was 6.4% in the five years prior to the COVID-19 pandemic. Maldives has pro-market policies and offers a liberal and transparent business environment. These include no restrictions on repatriation of profits and capital proceeds, no foreign exchange restrictions, and the availability of international arbitration and dispute settlement. It has an educated and tech-savvy young

workforce, with 98% literacy and 63% mobile internet usage in 2019. The regulations governing foreign investments have been streamlined, with clear and convenient procedures for investors looking to invest in Maldives.

What are the key responsibilities of the High Commission of Maldives in Singapore in terms of facilitating bilateral ties, investment, and trade? How does the High Commission support the overall diplomatic relationship between the two countries?

HC: The High Commission acts as the main medium through which all bilateral activities between Maldives and Singapore take place. It facilitates, coordinates, and executes all Government-to-Government activities and cooperation between the two countries.

Are there any current or upcoming initiatives, events, or programmes involving Maldives that will take place in Singapore this year?

HC: Yes, there are several initiatives and events involving Maldives scheduled to take place in Singapore this year. These include participation in the ITB Singapore, NATAS Fair, Singapore Red Cross charity food fair, travel agents and media briefing on investment opportunities in Maldives, and think tank discussions.

With the upcoming 2023 Maldivian presidential election scheduled for September, what impact do you foresee on the bilateral relationship between Maldives and Singapore?

HC: The upcoming presidential election is an important event for Maldives, and the result will play a crucial role in shaping the country's future policies and direction. However, historically, our bilateral relationship has remained strong and unaffected by political changes. We are confident that our enduring partnership will continue to flourish regardless of the election outcome.



CLIMATE CHANGE ACTION Interview with Minister of State for Environment, Climate Change and Technology

CLIMATE CHANGE: STRIVING TO LEAD BY EXAMPLE

Ms Khadeeja Naseem, the Minister of State for Environment, Climate Change and Technology, said Maldives is a frontline state in the fight against Climate Change and is preparing for a war that it does not intend to lose. She outlines the steps taken by the nation to prepare, mitigate and adapt to the new realities

How is the Maldives addressing the challenges posed by climate change?

Maldives as one of the most low-lying nations, is on the very frontline of the climate crisis, and climate change is an existential threat to us. For us, the climate crisis is not looming in the distant future, it is already an everyday lived

reality. Across the archipelago we are experiencing coastal erosion, increasing severity in storm surges; and disrupted rainfall patterns, making it unpredictable to forecast. Rising sea levels have salinized and depleted the freshwater aquifers in countless islands. All of this is at the current 1.1 degrees of warming, and as the IPCC has warned us, countries like ours cannot adapt past 1.5 degrees. As H.E. President Ibrahim

Mohamed Solih stated at the UN General Assembly in 2021: "...the difference between 1.5 degrees and 2 degrees is a death sentence for the Maldives."

The Maldives is working to address climate crisis on many fronts. We are spending lots of resources to build resilience of our communities and islands, as such programmes and projects are ongoing to climate-proof our vital infrastructure by better planning and developing necessary standards and regulation, and relocating this infrastructure to more inland areas. In addition, we are investing on addressing water insecurity, increasing food security, strengthening early warning capacity, providing coastal defences to protect the islands against erosion and storm surges, and protecting the fragile ecosystems of our islands and coral reefs. As such, we have introduced polices to reduce and phase-out single-use plastics; we have also initiated programmes to increase conservation of significant species and natural habitats and contribute to the livelihoods and well-being of local communities by protection of at least one island, one reef, and one wetland from each atoll. We have been able to establish 79 protected areas, which legally protect all biodiversity hotpots across Maldives. The three atolls, Baa Atoll, Addu and Fuvahmulah have been designated as UNESCO MAN and Biosphere Reserves.

The energy sector accounts for nearly half of our fuel imports, so efforts made to reduce fuel consumption are essential steps in our green recovery. We are also working on facilitating private investment in renewable energy. We have a nearnegligible contribution to climate change at a mere 0.0035% of global emissions, and yet, we want to do our part to limit global emissions to achieve the 1.5-degree temperature goal of the Paris Agreement.

We are also investing a lot on increasing renewables in our energy mix; as such, various programmes are underway to install solar PVs, home solar programmes, energy labelling programmes and also net metering initiates are well in place. This is to reduce our emissions and increase energy security by reducing the dependency on fossil fuels.

That is why we have made a very ambitious pledge to achieve Net Zero by 2030, if we get the necessary support and finance from donors. That's because we strive to lead by example even in the climate change mitigation space.

2. It would be great to hear about some successful initiatives in the Maldives that promote climate action. Could you provide an overview of those?

It's difficult to make a specific example with one particular case, but the programmes that we implement to increase the resilience of our islands such as coastal protection, conservation of our marine ecosystems and provision of safe water and climate-proofing of our vital infrastructure, are important initiatives from which we could draw lessons. While implementing these projects, we try our best to protect our fragile ecosystems and maintain the aesthetic and uniqueness of our islands.

3. In terms of global efforts to combat climate change, how do you envision the role of the Maldives? Are there collaborations or partnerships you are currently pursuing with Singapore?

Maldives actively participates in international climate change negotiations to strongly advocate for countries like ours. Last year at COP27, Maldives was among the countries that most strongly advocated for the establishment of a Loss and Damage fund.

COME EXPERIENCE LIFE IN THE MALDIVES

This is a personal invitation from Maldives to Singaporeans. Come experience the life and lifestyle of Maldivians

THE Maldives is famous for its 'One Island One Resort' uniqueness that attracts visitors from far and near. The Maldives also offers options galore. For example, a traveller can sample community-based tourism by staying in the local islands. You can stay in guest houses and hotels. While you stay at an island you don't only see the breathtaking views but you can also experience local living!

There are literally hundreds of islands to explore from this perspective. It might seem overwhelming to decide on where to go. We'll let you in on a little secret there's no such thing as the perfect island. There is only the 'perfect island for you', depending on your unique craving in the Maldives. Some islands to choose from are: Thulusdhoo, Gulhi, Himmafushi or Maafushi which are favourites amongst surfers; an island such as Thoddoo, on the other hand, might be a good option if you are seeking to spend your days winding through beautiful farmlands and lush greenery. If you're more interested in nature, such as areas like mangroves and lakes, there are multiple sites on islands all over the Maldives, which have great air and sea connectivity to make travel easy as pie.

Once you find your island, simply make a booking online, call the guesthouse or hotel, and let them know that you're in the Maldives already. The guesthouse will arrange the transport for you. Most of the speedboats heading off to local islands will leave from the jetty near the Republic Square in Malé city. However, if you're keen on taking a ferry to your local island, you can check the schedule on Maldives Transport and Contracting Company (MTCC). If you're unable to find it, call them and check when and where the ferry departs. As exciting as a speedboat is, there is a special charm to a dhoni journey. The dhoni gives you the time to slow down and tap into the Maldivian groove. Note that the MTCC ferries do not travel to all the Maldivian islands, and if you're travelling far from Malé, it's best to arrange the transport through the hotel or guesthouse.

Make sure you have booked a guesthouse before you reach your local island, this is very important as accommodation may not be available for on-arrival bookings. It will also make you very happy to know that the boutique hotels and guesthouses in the Maldives offer the same world-renowned hospitality that the luxury resorts are popular for, as well as having equally gorgeous powder-soft beaches and blue skies stretching as far as the eye can see. 




