

ASEAN Jubilee Meeting in Manila

inister for Foreign Affairs Dr Vivian Balakrishnan attended the 50th ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Meeting (AMM), Post-Ministerial Conferences (PMCs), 18th ASEAN Plus Three (APT) Foreign Ministers' Meeting (FMM), 7th East Asia Summit (EAS) FMM and 24th ASEAN Regional Forum (ARF) in Manila, Philippines from 3 to 8 August 2017.

Against the backdrop of ASEAN's 50th Anniversary this year, the ASEAN Foreign Ministers (FMs) took stock of progress in regional cooperation and planned the path ahead for the **ASEAN Community Vision 2025**. Dicussions covered ■ How to strengthen ASEAN Centrality and unity

■ Review ASEAN's external relations and exchange views on regional and international issues.

At the PMCs, the ASEAN FMs met their counterparts from ASEAN's Dialogue Partners (namely Australia, Canada, China, the European Union, India, Japan, New Zealand, the Republic of Korea, Russia and the United States) to discuss both ongoing and future cooperation. The ASEAN FMs will also engage their counterparts at the APT FMM, EAS FMM and ARF on key regional developments and the evolving regional architecture. Minister Balakrishnan will be accompanied by officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Dr VB Visit Sri Lanka



inister for Foreign Affairs Dr Vivian Balakrishnan made an introductory visit to the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka from 17 to 20 July 2017. Minister Balakrishnan visited Colombo and Jaffna.

In Colombo, Minister Balakrishnan called on President Maithripala Sirisena and was hosted to dinner by Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe (*pictured above*). Minister Balakrishnan met Minister of Foreign Affairs Ravi Karunanayake, Minister of Megapolis and Western Development Champika Ran-

awaka, Minister of Development Strategies and International Trade Malik Samarawickrama, Minister of Law and Order and Southern Development Sagala Ratnayaka and Leader of the Opposition Rajavarothiam Sampanthan.

During the meetings with Sri Lankan leaders, Minister Balakrishnan reaffirmed the warm and growing relations between Singapore and Sri Lanka, and discussed ways to expand bilateral cooperation. Minister Balakrishnan underscored the importance of the expeditious conclusion of the Sri Lanka - Singapore Free Trade Agreement negotiations. Minister Karunanayake hosted Minister Balakrishnan and Australian Minister for Foreign Affairs Julie Bishop to a joint breakfast meeting, where they discussed trade, investment and connectivity initiatives across the Indian Ocean. Minister Balakrishnan also witnessed the signing of a MOU between the Singapore Red Cross and the Sri Lankan Red Cross on relief and rehabilitation programmes in Sri Lanka.

In Jaffna, Minister Balakrishnan met Governor of the Northern Province Reginald Cooray and Chief Minister of the Northern Province C V Wigneswaran where he expressed Singapore's support for Sri Lanka's development and national reconciliation process. He also participated in a book donation ceremony from the Singapore National Library Board to the Jaffna Public Library and the launch of a Lee Foundation-SingHealth Orthopaedic Development Programme at the University of Jaffna.

New Canadian Scholarship Programme for ASEAN Jubilee

o mark ASEAN's 50th Anniversary and the 40th Anniversary of ASEAN-Canada dialogue partner relations, the Honourable Chrystia Freeland, Minister of Foreign Affairs, announced on behalf of the Honourable Marie-Claude Bibeau, Minister of International Development and La Francophonie, that Canada will support a new scholarship programme for ASEAN. This initiative will provide US\$10 million over five years for post-secondary students and mid-career professionals from Southeast Asia to access world-class education in Canada. The Minister made the announcement at the Canada-ASEAN Post Ministerial Conference in Manila, Philippines.

Canada is committed to combating poverty and promoting human rights in Southeast Asia, especially the rights of women, girls and migrants. The Scholarships and Educational Exchanges for Development initiative will provide individuals from ASEAN member states, especially women, the opportunity to apply for short-term studies or research in Canada. Scholarships will be awarded in fields that contribute to ASEAN's efforts to narrow the development gap and reduce poverty in Southeast Asia, such as climate-smart agriculture, renewable energy, public financial management, and sexual and reproductive health and rights of women and girls.

Global Ceylon Tea Party

n 6th July 2017 to mark the 150th Anniversary of Ceylon Tea, a 24-hour long global tea party was hosted by Sri Lanka's Diplomatic Missions around the world. Starting in Fiji and spreading across every time zone, starting sharp at five in the evening at each of the 50 or so countries taking part.

Tea is Sri Lanka's most important agricultural commodity, with Ceylon Tea being one of the top exporters of the nation. The tea industry has played a vital role in shaping not only the economic, but cultural and social identities of the country as well, so such a grand celebration was definitely in order.

The Sri Lankan embassy here organized the Singaporean segment of the record-breaking tea party, inviting members of the Singapore community to take part in the celebrations. The host, HE Mr Nimal Weeratne, the High Commissioner of Sri Lanka in Singapore, proudly recalled the humble beginnings of Ceylon Tea and its inspirational journey of 150 years.

Guests were treated to a generous spread of Sri Lankan delicacies but the star of the evening was, of course, the piping hot cups of freshlybrewed Ceylon Tea of every flavour imaginable, which put a smile on everyone's faces











PM Lee Visit to Germany and G20 Summit

Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong was on a working visit to Germany from 6 to 11 July 2017 at the invitation of Her Excellency Angela Merkel, Chancellor of the Federal Republic of Germany. PM Lee visited Berlin and Hamburg (to attend the G20 Leaders' Summit) and Munich.

In Berlin, PM Lee was hosted to lunch by Chancellor Merkel where they discussed ways to further strengthen bilateral cooperation, as well as regional and international issues of mutual interest.

In Hamburg, PM Lee participated in the G20 Leaders' Summit discussions on global economic growth, trade and finance, digitalisation and jobs, as well as other global challenges such as climate change and public health. The Prime Minister also had bilateral meetings with other leaders on the sidelines of the Summit.

In Munich, Prime Minister Lee had

roundtable discussions with business leaders from top German Multinational Corporations, Mittelstand and World Market Leaders. He was the Guest-of-Honour at the Certificate Presentation Ceremony for the newly-appointed Singapore Economic Ambassadors for the Mittelstand, and at Siemens' launch of their Singapore Digitalisation Hub. Prime Minister Lee also attended a National Day Reception with the Singapore Community while he was there.

Prime Minister Lee was accompanied by Mrs Lee, Minister for Foreign Affairs Vivian Balakrishnan, Minister for Finance Heng Swee Keat, as well as senior officials from the Prime Minister's Office, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Finance, the Economic Development Board and Monetary Authority of Singapore.



Joyful Announcement at Colombia National Day Reception

HE Mauricio Baquero Parado, Charge d Affairs to the Republic of Singapore shared with joy "The oldest internal conflict in Latin America has come to an end. After almost five years of negotiations, the Colombian Government and the FARC signed a Peace Agreement".

The Colombian National Day was celebrated on July 20th at Park Royal Hotel where Mr Amrin Amin, Singapore's Parliamentary Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs and Ministry of Health was the guest of Honour. Also attending were Members of Parliament Mr Sitoh Yih Pin and Mr Murali Pillai.

In his welcome address marking the 207th Anniversary of Columbia's independence, he said this has been a very positive year for the country as well as a very productive one in its bilateral relationship with Singapore. The new Peace Agreement with the FARC will place Colombia into a new era of peace and development. He quoted the President of Colombia who said, "Peace is the road to reconciliation, to opportunities, to development, to tranquillity and to a more solid and deep democracy.

... Peace summons us all." Ambassador Parado who is in his third year in Singapore said the Colombian Embassy was established in 1982 and next December will be its thirty-fifth Anniversary and that the City-State is a model of sustainable development, economic growth, productivity and innovation. Colombia too has a very attractive business environment, with a competitive legal framework and it is well interconnected to the world economy. According with UNTACD, in 2016, it was the third most attractive country in Latin America for foreign investors, bringing more than US\$13,500 millions of dollars its economy.
