H.E. Nikolay Rishatovich Kudashev, Ambassador of the Russian Federation



PRIOR to his accreditation here Ambassador Nikolay Kudashev served as Ambassador to India from 2017 to February 2022. A career diplomat, he joined the diplomatic service in 1981 and has held various positions within foreign missions of

the then-USSR/Russia. He was posted to the USSR Embassy in Singapore from 1981 to 1985. Thereafter, he was posted to Manila from 1992 to 1996, and to New Delhi from 1999 to 2005. He was appointed Ambassador to the Philippines from 2010 to 2015, and was concurrently accredited to Palau, Marshall Islands, and the Federated States of Micronesia.

Ambassador Kudashev holds the diplomatic rank of Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary. He graduated from the Moscow State Institute of International Relations (MGIMO), Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the USSR in 1981. He is married with one daughter, and also speaks Chinese and English.





PRIOR to his appointment as Ambassador to Singapore, Ambassador Chutintorn Gongsakdi was the Deputy Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Thailand responsible for multilateral cooperation. He was appointed Ambassadordesignate of Thailand to the Republic of Singapore since 23 February 2022. He arrived in Singapore on 25 March 2022.

His past professional experience has mostly been in multilateral and regional economic diplomacy, including ASEAN, APEC, OECD and WTO. He was seconded to the APEC Secretariat in Singapore during 2001-2004. As Ambassador of Thailand to the Republic of India during 2017-2020, his objective was to strengthen the Thailand-ASEAN-India relationship in all its dimensions.

He graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Economics from Victoria University, New Zealand and a Master of International Studies degree from Birmingham University, the United Kingdom. He is married to M.L. Piyawan Gongsakdi and has one daughter.

PM Jacinda Ardern's Second Official Visit



Expanding the Scope of the EP [Enhanced Partnership]



Singapore and NZ Prime Ministers focussed on bilateral cooperation in trade and economics, security and defence, science, technology and innovation, people-to-people links as well as introducing new areas of cooperation

Jo Tyndall on the significance of the NZ PM go to: www.indiplomacy.com **PRIME** Minister of New Zealand, Ms Jacinda Ardern made an Official Visit to Singapore from 18th to 20th April 2022. During the visit both Singapore and NZ reaffirmed the excellent level of bilateral relations which are underpinned by the Singapore-New Zealand Enhanced Partnership (EP) established during Prime Minister Ardern's last Official Visit to Singapore in 2019.

During her visit PM Ardern also called on President Halimah Yacob. A Singapore Ministry of Foreign Affairs statement released following the visit said the leaders discussed the strong COVID-19 cooperation between both sides, which demonstrated both countries are close partners who can rely on each other in times of need. They had an engaging conversation on the contributions and progress of women in both countries. They also discussed the importance of maintaining social cohesion, particularly in diverse, multicultural societies such as Singapore and New Zealand.

New Areas of Cooperation

Prime Minister Lee and Prime Minister Ardern reaffirmed the warm and excellent bilateral relations, which were upgraded to an Enhanced Partnership (EP) during Prime Minister Ardern's last visit in 2019. The Prime Ministers were pleased with the good progress made under the EP across the four pillars of trade and economics, security and defence, science, technology and innovation, as well as people-to-people ties. They also welcomed the close cooperation between Singapore and New Zealand during the COVID-19 pandemic, including an air freight connectivity partnership that brought food supplies into Singapore and sent essential medical supplies to New Zealand. The Prime Ministers agreed to explore new areas of

cooperation to keep the EP forward-looking. They announced the establishment of a new pillar on "climate change and green economy" (see accompanying box above) under the EP.

Singapore and NZ Supply Chain Working Group

As the region adapts to evolving global trends and supply chain vulnerabilities, the Prime Ministers agreed that increasing economic resilience will be crucial. The Prime Ministers agreed to launch a Singapore and New Zealand Supply Chain Working Group. They asked officials, working closely with the private sector, to identify opportunities for collaboration in support of more productive, resilient, sustainable, and digitally enhanced supply chains for enterprises of all sizes and for improved food and energy security in both countries.

Vaccinated Travel Framework

The Prime Ministers also welcomed the timely launch of the Vaccinated Travel Framework by Singapore from 1 April 2022, and New Zealand's reopening of borders to visa-free countries, including Singapore, from 1 May 2022. The reopening of borders is an important step towards living with COVID-19, and is critical in restoring the people-to-people and business links between both countries and with the rest of the world. The establishment of a bilateral Working Holiday Scheme will allow young Singaporeans and New Zealanders to travel and work in each other's countries.

H.E. Jo Tyndall on NZ Prime Minster Visit

Following the successful visit by the PM of New Zealand Jacinta Ardern the High Commissioner of New Zealand to Singapore H.E. Jo Tyndall talks to *IN Diplomacy* publisher and editor-in-chief Ms Nomita Dhar about some of the highlights of the memorable visit and a personal insight into the much admired prime minister



Congratulations on the very successful visit of Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern to Singapore. What in your opinion are the highlights of the visit?

THE fact that PM Ardern made Singapore her first stop speaks of the value New Zealand places on the bilateral relationship between our two countries. She also brought trade minister, Damien O'Connor, and a high-level business delegation. Meeting virtually has helped us get through the pandemic, but nothing beats face-to-face contact, and the

PM's visit was a clear signal that New Zealand is open for business (and open for travellers from Singapore from 2nd May 2022)

This was her first overseas trip in over two years, so there were many memorable moments, but for me the following really stood out:
PM Ardern having an orchid named after her – the 'Dendrobium Jacinda Ardern' is a beautiful bright pink.

• The unveiling of the imposing and jaw-dropping 'kūwaha' (carved doorway). This totara wood piece was created by the New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute, and now installed at the Gardens By the Bay Cloud Forest.

• The signing of the Sustainable Aviation Arrangement in front of the Jewel Rainfall Vortex at Changi Airport. The presence of CEOs of New Zealand and Singapore airlines and airports, as well as CAAS, underscored the sector's commitment to partnership to find ways to get to "net zero" emissions.

New Dean Interview

H.E. Kakhramon Shakirov: Top Priorities - Support Diplomatic Colleagues and Promotion of Bilateral & Multilateral Ties

The Ambassador of the Republic of Uzbekistan has represented his country in Singapore since 2018 and was recently appointed the Dean of the Diplomatic Corps in Singapore. In an interview with *IN Diplomacy's* Editor-in-Chief Ms Nomita Dhar, he speaks of the strong ties between the two countries and fresh areas of collaboration as well as his plans and initiatives following his new appointment

WE are honoured to have this discussion with you, particularly since you have just been chosen as the Dean of the Diplomatic Corps. How does it feel?

This is my first posting as an ambassador, and I never expected to be appointed the Dean representing the esteemed diplomatic corps in beautiful Singapore. For me, it's both a challenge and a huge opportunity.

The pandemic had put everything on standstill. Now that things are normalizing, what are the fresh responsibilities this new role brings? First, the opening of borders and easing of restrictions. The Singapore government did a commendable job of taking care of the diplomatic corps during that very difficult period, ensuring that we were constantly updated on the latest developments and that we felt very safe here during that period.

Now we need to double the speed to make things happen between various embassies and countries represented here in Singapore.

Recollecting the COVID-19 period, how did you work with your diplomatic colleagues to ease issues that arose due to the pandemic?

This was mostly done online. We had zoom meetings, not only within the diplomatic corps and with friends, but for all communications with Singapore's ministry for foreign affairs, which did a commendable job of periodically briefing us on news and the measures being taken by the government during the pandemic.

As the new Dean, what is your role, and what is expected of you during your term?

My primary role is to support my colleagues, accelerate the embassy activities, and at the same time arrange joint events, with our friends from the government, business, and social circles and represent our country in some forums on the bilateral side and maybe some from the regional side. Also, to strengthen social activities in Singapore.

What are your plans for restarting these?

We will bring together members from embassies and consulates. This will be both a social gathering and a platform for discussions on bilateral issues between countries to discuss new ideas on deeper engagement, cooperation, and collaboration with Singapore in this new post-COVID-19 era.

A lot is going on in international geopolitics, and not everything can be solved by discussions. How can you collectively work towards giving a better direction to the issues humanity faces right now?

I feel this is best done through negotiations, collaborations, and a joint effort by all at the bilateral and the multinational level. Every country wants to help to maintain stability. As ambassadors, we need to work to enhance cooperation with Singapore on various international issues at both the bilateral and multinational levels.

ELEVEN years ago four countries: Chile, Colombia, Mexico and Peru, decided to form a deep integration mechanism to move towards the free circulation of goods, services, capital and people and the Pacific Alliance (PA) was born. Today, the PA has 61 Observer States and has successfully concluded negotiations with Singapore which became the Alliance's first Associate State.

This year Mexico holds the pro tempore presidency and the Embassy helmed the organisation of a special gathering to celebrate the anniversary at Canchita Peruvian Cuisine. The four members of the PA represented here in Singapore by their ambassadors are His Excellencies

Mr Raul Ignacio Concha Sepulveda (Chile), Mr Manuel Hernando Solano Sossa (Colombia). Mr Carlos Raul Vasquez Corrales (Peru) and Mr Agustin Garcia Lopez Loaeza (Mexico). Singapore was represented by Minister of State for Trade and Industry Mr Alvin Tan who shared in the festivities with the iconic drinks and dishes from the four PA nations.

PA Note: The PA nations combined GDP of more than US\$2 trillion makes it the eighth-largest economy in the world with a combined population of 230 million. There are currently estimated about 100 Singapore companies operating there in sectors such as trade, technology and innovation, and infrastructure.
